

From The Rectory

Providence

One of my favourite people on TV some years ago was Sister Wendy Beckett, the nun who loved art. Her observations were very personal and sometimes quirky and surprising; art critics were not enamoured with her, however, as she didn't always follow their rules and frequently spoke out of turn.

One of the things I liked about her was her unpredictability and freshness which she brought to each program. In fact, that she was there at all was a product of her spontaneous nature: not only was she a Carmelite nun, but was also a contemplative, living a life of prayer alone living in a caravan which still serves as her hermitage. Spending much of her time alone, well away from the other nuns in the main house, she is not a typical TV presenter; this is a job that normally calls for an extrovert, one who lives on the outside rather than the inside of his personality.

A clue to the way that she found herself on our screens is to be found in her book on prayer where she deals with providence. She says, 'Sometimes we can see for ourselves that what appears disastrous, the very thing we did not want, turns out to be a blessing. For example, I would never have chosen to leave my solitude to work in television. I did it because it seemed right'.

Providence leads us to put God at the centre of our lives rather than ourselves and our own ambitions and desires. Like Sister Wendy, I have learned at many times in my life to trust in the guiding hand of God even when that seems like foolishness and as a result my life has been (in my terms) successful and fulfilled.

One of the keys to sustaining that trust in providence has been to try to remain half-full. There are people for whom life is half-empty: they look for the bit that's missing, focus on the problem, find something to criticise. Such people can never be satisfied and spend their time chasing rainbows. People who are half-full, on the other hand look for what they have rather than what they want, focus on the solution, and find things to celebrate and to praise. As Sister Wendy goes on to say, 'It is not reality that conforms itself to our needs, but that we learn how to conform ourselves to what reality is offering. What I call "providence" is always there in wait, as it were. What prayer does is to alert us to its presence so that we are always making the best of things and not the worst. Tragedy and frustration remain their painful selves, but prayer in accepting them changes the pain into something redemptive'.

If we really trust in God we try to live as people who are half-full, but not with a blind optimism; rather we live as those who recognise what God has given us and we place our gift of life into God's hands, putting him at the centre rather than ourselves. We go places we never thought we could go, find confidence we didn't know we had and find strength in ourselves that only God can reveal to us.

CANAL RAMBLINGS



In one of my previous articles I mentioned that I had seen 56 different bird species on my canal walks, that has now increased by two, one of those is the Little Egret which is a member of the heron family. I saw this lovely bird in a pond that was created by all the rain that had fallen in a farmers field near all Saints Church, Church Lawton. All white with a black slender beak, black legs and yellow feet make it easily recognisable. This bird used to be a rare sight in Britain until numbers increased in the late 1980s and was first recorded breeding in Dorset in 1996. Since then numbers have increased significantly, by 2001 breeding pairs had increased to over one hundred and by 2015 had passed one thousand pairs. The majority of the population are located in southern England, East Anglia and Ireland but they are gradually moving northwards probably driven by global warming and they are now seen regularly in Scotland.

The Little Egret has now been followed by another two previously rare vagrants to Britain, the Cattle Egret which first bred in 2008 in Somerset and the Great White Egret which first bred in 2012 on the Somerset levels. Those two birds are also slowly moving northwards and you never know I might see them on one of my walks, here's hoping.

When Sue and I lived in the far north of Scotland in the small village of Forsinard one of my summer jobs was the information warden at the R.S.P.B Forsinard flows nature reserve. The job entailed working in the visitor centre which was housed in the old station ticket office and waiting room, I also led two guided walks per week out onto the reserve to show visitors the fauna and flora of that special area. On some occasions I would take part in carrying out bird surveys, red deer surveys plant surveys etc, this involved walking various areas of the reserve and taking note of what we had seen, these were special days as we would be out in this wild landscape for 5 or 6 hours. The reserve is enormous and today I think it covers 50,000 acres, the largest R.S.P.B reserve. We were fortunate enough to have a Golden Eagles nest site on the reserve and this particular year two chicks had hatched out, one female and one male. On the day they were to be ringed I was asked to accompany Norrie the reserve manager and the legendary birding figure that is Roy Dennis, he is very well known in the birding world for his work with Ospreys, Eagles, Sea Eagles and so much more. We had a long drive on forestry tracks and then an hours walk over the bog to reach the Eyrie which was sited on a small cliff which made it quite easy to scale and remove the young Eagles. The young birds were around six to seven weeks old and fairly well grown, it was such a wonderful experience as I held the female as she was being ringed and a GPS locator fitted. I felt so grateful that I was asked by Norrie to experience such a magical day out and one that I will never forget.

Midnight Charity Walk For Hospice




